March 8: LITTLE FIRES EVERYWHERE by Celeste Ng ; discussion at the home of Trish and JT Thompson
The runaway New York Times bestseller from the bestselling author of Everything I Never Told You, a riveting novel that traces the intertwined fates of the pictureperfect Richardson family and the enigmatic mother and daughter who upend their lives. May 17th: LESS by Andrew Sean Greer; discussion at the home of Donna and Tony Giamberdino

Arthur Less will almost fall in love in Paris, almost fall to his death in Berlin, barely escape to a Moroccan ski chalet from a Saharan sandstorm, accidentally book himself as the (only) writer-in-residence at a Christian Retreat Center in Southern India, and encounter, on a desert island in the Arabian Sea, the last person on Earth he wants to face. Somewhere in there: he will turn fifty. Through it all, there is his first love. And there is his last. Because, despite all these mishaps, missteps, misunderstandings and mistakes, Less is, above all, a love story. ## UCC Treasurers Mid- Year Report Snapshot offinancial performance through June 30, 2018

The information presented below is to provide the CUCC members a financial update at the midpoint of our budget year. I will publish another update after the third quarter ending September 30, 2018. If any member has questions about any of the information presented below, please reach out to me and I will try to answer your questions. The best way to reach me is by leaving a note with the Church office with your contact information.
Below is an overview of the financial charts shown below through June 30, 2018:

- The Church received approximately $\$ 237,500$ of Pledged Income, $\$ 47,500$ of contributions and $\$ 14,700$ of other revenue from facility usage, preschool and interest for a total revenue of S298,700. This is $51 \%$ of the $\$ 584,204$ total revenue budgeted for 2018.
- The expenditures incurred through June 30 are $\$ 298,161$, or $48.6 \%$ of the total budgeted of $\$ 613,405$.
- Pledged income is $77.5 \%$ of our total budgeted revenue. Contributions are budgeted at $15 \%$ of our total budgeted revenue. Contributions consist of un-pledged member and non-member donations. There are approximately 168 members in 2018 that made pledges and additional 25 members that did not pledge but give monthly.
- The council budget is the most uncertain of the budgets incurred. You will note $90 \%$ of the council budget relates to the building and its usage. The building maintenance and repairs lines are anticipated to exceed their respective budgets, due to unforeseen snowplowing, parking lot repairs, lighting upgrades and tree maintenance. Each year, this budgeted expense is becoming more challenging to predict due to the age of our building.
