Pastoral Transition Update

Thank you to the many members of the congregation that have reached out to share their thoughts and suggestions regarding our pastoral transition. Please know that everyone is being heard and your feedback has been shared and discussed. A lot of careful thought and prayer is being put into this effort. Council has met a number of times over the past few weeks, including once with Rev. Jim Olson, our Fox Valley Association Minister. Rev. Olson has been a valuable resource for us and will continue to provide guidance throughout our pastoral transition process. He also has agreed to join us on February 3rd to lead our worship service and will make himself available following the service to answer any questions we may have.

After speaking with Rev. Olson and evaluating a number of potential paths, Council has decided to enter into a period of discernment to give our church time to contemplate our future as a congregational community. We are in the process of working with the Association to secure what is known as a "designated-term" pastor who will join us for a specific period of time to provide ministerial continuity while also helping to guide us through the discernment process and, ultimately, prepare the way for a new settled senior pastor. The timeframe for this process is still being determined and will be driven, in part, by the available pastoral candidates.

In the meantime, we have secured coverage for worship services through February and are working with Pastor Dave and Pastor Josh to ensure continuity of all active church programs. We will be tapping both internal and external resources, using "Pulpit Supply" (a.k.a. guest) ministers as needed until we have determined a longer-term solution.

Throughout this process, we are committed to being as transparent as possible and will be providing regular updates and education along the way. Following Rev. Olson's visit in February, we will be hosting a series of church talks and informational sessions that will allow everyone in the congregation a chance to contribute to the process as we work toward ensuring the health and well-being of our church moving forward.

As always, we welcome your thoughts and prayers and are confident that we will continue to thrive together as a congregation. If you have questions or comments related to the pastoral transition or any other church-related concerns, please feel free to email Council@cuccstc.org.

On January 20, we invite all members of the church to come to Rodgers Hall immediately after the worship service for a special coffee fellowship to honor and say thank you to Pastor Dave for his time and service to our church. We hope to see you there.





January 25th: DOUBLE INDEMNITY by James M. Cain; discussion at the home of Janet Zohorsky

James M. Cain, virtuoso of the Roman noir, gives us a tautly narrated and excruciatingly suspenseful story in *Double Indemnity*, an X-ray view of guilt, of duplicity, and of the kind of obsessive, loveless love that devastates everything it touches. Walter Huff was an insurance salesman with an unfailing instinct for clients who might be in trouble, and his instinct led him to Phyllis Nirdlinger. Phyllis wanted to buy an accident policy on her husband. Then she wanted her husband to have an accident. Walter wanted Phyllis. To get her, he would arrange the perfect murder and betray everything he had ever lived for. Adapted into the 1944 classic film noir directed by Billy Wilder, starring Fred MacMurray and Barbara Stanwick.

March 8: LITTLE FIRES EVERYWHERE by Celeste Ng; discussion at the home of Trish and JT Thompson

The runaway *New York Times* bestseller from the bestselling author of Everything I Never Told You, a riveting novel that traces the intertwined fates of the picture-perfect Richardson family and the enigmatic mother and daughter who upend their lives. In Shaker Heights, a placid, progressive suburb of Cleveland, everything is planned – from the layout of the winding roads, to the colors of the houses, to the successful lives its residents will go on to lead. And no one embodies this spirit more than Elena Richardson, whose guiding principle is playing by the rules. Enter Mia Warren – an enigmatic artist and single mother – who arrives in this idyllic bubble with her teenaged daughter Pearl, and rents a house from the Richardson's. But Mia carries with her a mysterious past and a disregard for the status quo that threatens to upend this carefully ordered community. Pop Tabs for Ronald McDonald House



Keeping Families Together.

Many families travel far from home and spend several weeks or months to get treatment for their seriously ill or injured children – a long time to be away or to divide a family. And, for children facing a serious medical crisis, nothing seems scarier than not having mom and dad close by for love and support. A Ronald McDonald House provides a place for families to call home so they can stay close by their hospitalized child at little to no cost.

Houses are built on the simple idea that nothing else should matter when a family is focused on the health of their child – not where they can afford to stay, where they will get their next meal or where they will lay their head at night to rest. They believe that when a child is hospitalized the love and support of family is as powerful as the strongest medicine prescribed.

Allow Families to Face the Weight of Illness Together - Families are stronger when they are together, which helps in the healing process. By staying at a Ronald McDonald House, parents also can better communicate with their child's medical team and keep up with complicated treatment plans when needed. They can also focus on the health of their child, rather than grocery shopping, cleaning or cooking meals.

When your child is sick, you want the best care possible – even if it is hundreds or thousands of miles away. The Ronald McDonald House allows families to access specialized medical treatment by providing a place to stay at little or sometimes no cost. The generosity of volunteers and donors make it all possible. In return, families either stay at no cost or are asked to make a donation up to \$25 per day, depending on the House. The RMHC Global Policy is that families are never turned away; if it's not possible to pay, the fee is waived.

That's why we are collecting pop tabs for RMH; to help fund this ministry. No cost to you - just save them off the tops of beverage cans, soup cans, etc., and bring them to church. Put small amounts in the little green bag on the hutch outside of the offce, or larger amounts in my mailbox in the office.

MLK Week of Service

The Mission Committee would like to announce two events for service for MLK Week of Service. The week begins January 19 with an opportunity for families to volunteer at Feed My Starving Children in Aurora. The week ends with another chance for families to serve at the Northern Illinois Food Bank on January 26. The sign-ups will be posted December 30 and there will be a limit of 20 for each event.

There a few guidelines for each event, listed below.

Feed my Starving Children: Saturday, January 19th - 9 to 11

Please consider these student-to-adult ratios when registering to volunteer (please remember there are only 20 slots available):

- For safety reasons, children under the age of 5 are not allowed in the packing area (sorry, no exceptions)
- Grades K-2: 1 student to 1 adult
- Grades 3-6: 3 students to 1 adult
- Grades 7-9: 4 students to 1 adult
- Grades 10-12: 5 students to 1 adult

To comply with FDA requirements and remove all possibility for foreign objects to fall into meals (which could cause choking, tooth breakage and more), FMSC volunteers must remove all jewelry (including watches) and/or accessories before packing. When wearing wedding bands with stones will require the volunteer to wear gloves. Medic alert bracelets may be worn.

Northern Illinois Food Bank Saturday, January 26th, 9 to 12

Children ages 8 and older may volunteer with families or in groups with adult chaperones. Chaperone ratios are 1:4 for ages 8-13 and 1:10 for ages 14-17 (with only 20 slots available).

Please note: Flip-flops and sandals are not allowed at either location.
