March 8: LITTLE FIRES EVERYWHERE by Celeste Ng; discussion at the home of Trish and JT Thompson

First Communion Sunday

First communion is scheduled to be during the worship service on March 3rd for all of our second graders. In preparation for first communion, they will have two lessons in the month of February on the 17th and 24th.

The first lesson is on February 17th during Sunday school hours. Here we will learn all about the first communion, what taking communion means and how this is the next step in their spiritual journey. On February 24th, our second graders will have their second lesson during Sunday school hours as well. This lesson will be an actual re-enactment of the first communion. The children will get a chance to practice taking communion with pita bread and apple juice in ornate cups around a candle lit table. Then on March 3rd we will ask all second grade children to remain in the service with their parents. Third graders through 5th grade will join us towards the end of the service to watch them take their first communion and partake in communion themselves.

Night Ministry Helps Lazarus House!


