Josh's enthusiasm, devotion to our church and the UCC, and his passion for the Gospel make him an excellent candidate in whom we have great confidence. After much prayerful reflection, the council therefore unanimously and wholeheartedly recommends the Rev. Josh Kuipers for the call of Senior Pastor at the Congregational United Church of Christ of St. Charles. We are thrilled!

March 8: LITTLE FIRES EVERYWHERE by Celeste Ng; discussion at the home of Trish and JT Thompson

Pastor Emeritus William L. Nagy

Members and friends of our congregation were saddened by the death of Pastor Emeritus William L. Nagy on Monday, February 11, at the age of 88. He became pastor of our church in 1973 after serving churches in Evansville IN, and Foreston, Adeline, Bartlett and Crystal Lake, IL. He was a graduate of Hirsch High School-Chicago, Elmhurst College-Elmhurst IL, and Eden Seminary-Webster Grove MO. While serving our church, he also served for 27 years as the Chaplain for the St. Charles Fire Department.

Bill also accepted leadership roles in the Illinois Conference of the UCC, serving for 16 years on the Board of the Bensenville Home Society, 37 years as Director of Church Camps and as President of the Northern Association. In his retirement, he served as Chaplain at Pine Acres in DeKalb and as an interim pastor for several churches. Just last year, Bill received the Chalice Award which is given to servants of the church who have served the Illinois Conference, one or more of the Associations of the Conference, and/or one or more local churches while also giving service to the larger community. In the 1980's, Bill was chair of the capital funds campaign for Pilgrim Park that resulted in the beautiful Conference Center that we all enjoy so much today.

Rev. Nagy is survived by his wife of 65 years-Rozella, three children-Loren, Donald and Cheryl (Rev. Timothy) Rhodes; four grandchildren-Matthew (Bernadette) Nagy, Rev. Amanda (Kimberly) Nagy, Hannah Rhodes and Rachel Rhodes; two great grandchildren- Nash and Gunnar Nagy; his sister-Barbara Lane and his sister-in-law-Celia Drake.

A Service of Thanksgiving to God for the Life of Pastor Nagy was celebrated in our sanctuary on Saturday afternoon, February 16. Speakers included our own Pastor Josh, The Rev. Kathy Lawes-Prairie Association Pastor, The Rev. Eric Fistler-Senior Pastor of First Congregational Church in Crystal Lake, The Rev. James Olson-Fox Valley Interim Association Pastor, son Loren Nagy, and son-in-law The Rev. Tim Rhodes. As requested by Bill, lots of music, including an anthem – "On Eagles Wings" – by our Chancel Choir directed by Joe Blomberg – all to the accompaniment of Carol Latimer, our organist/pianist.

Needless to say, Pastor Bill will be greatly missed by all who knew and loved him. We are grateful for the life of this saint who has now joined the great cloud of witnesses in that heavenly family, into the company of all the saints, who from their labors rest. Well done, thy good and faithful servant.
